She will also work on a research project with a Harvard faculty member over the next year. The program sponsors only eight students per year nationally. 

Vince was a founding member of the original and current American Indian Center. He was instrumental in rallying the new Center and was one of our biggest supporters.




Ed Loonsfoot




American Indian Center of Springfield's
